## Dear City Council,

At your previous meeting on June 11, you received 23 public comments calling for scrutiny of how the city spends its portion of the Local Income Tax - Public Safety revenue, and urging the city to spend those dollars on public safety services other than policing.

At the start of that meeting, Council President Azar acknowledged that the comments were received and posted on the council's website. Because council members had not had sufficient time to study the comments submitted earlier that day, President Azar recommended delaying a more comprehensive response so that council members could better acquaint themselves with the issues raised.

A month has passed for council members to give these comments due attention. So, those of us who submitted comments on June 11 and others are returning with public comment tonight to ask that you take up this discussion in your July 9 meeting and explain how you will address the concerns raised in June.

First, there is one important point of clarification. In summarizing the public comments at the June 11 meeting, Council President Azar incorrectly said the comments were asking for the LIT money to be spent on something other than public safety. That is incorrect. These funds are by law designated for public safety. We want the city to invest these dollars in public safety alternatives to policing, including mental health services, drug treatment, homelessness intervention, social workers, and more — all of which can qualify as public safety expenses according to the LIT code.

We also want to thank Councilmember Nation and Councilmember Crossen for speaking into the record on June 11 to affirm the importance of the comments submitted that day. Also shared in that meeting was a report from Mayor Bennett that underscored the significant size and potential of these LIT Public Safety dollars. Mayor Bennett reported that the City's LIT Public Safety revenue will reach approximately \$1.8 million in 2020 with a smaller but still significant amount expected in 2021. In light of all the above, we call on the City Council to:

- 1. Read this comment into the public record during your July 11 electronic meeting.
- 2. Explain how you will bring transparency to how the city is currently spending its \$1.8 million in LIT -Public Safety revenue in 2020, and how it plans to spend LIT - Public Safety revenue in 2021.
- 3. Explain how you will use your authority and influence to give due consideration to spending these LIT Public Safety dollars on alternatives to policing.
