The Police Department is requesting an transfer of funds, totaling \$34,400.00 from Gasoline 02-422.010 to Services Contractual 03-432.010 (\$15,500.00) and Purchase of Equipment 04-444.010 (\$18,900.00).

The Police department's budgeted Gasoline line is projected to have a year-end surplus, believed to be due in large part to the COVID-19 pandemic. The department is requesting to utilize a portion of that projected surplus to cover anticipated deficits as follows:

Services Contractual 03-432.010 (\$15,500.00) due to substantially increased legal fees associated with the department's Merit Commission and several personnel issues that have arisen throughout the year, unforeseen veterinary expenditures for the department's K9's, and the addressing of environmental concerns and safety repairs to the department's firing range.

Purchase of Equipment 04-444.010 (\$18,900.00) to offset expenditures associated with equipment needs for the department's incoming prisoner transport vehicle, copier replacement costs for six (6) copiers, and for the purchase of several new speed control/radar signs which will be utilized by the department's traffic division to monitor traffic flow and vehicle speeds.
