- WHEREAS: in 1872 J. Sterling Morton proposed to the Nebraska Board of Agriculture that a special day be set aside for the planting of trees; and
- WHEREAS: this holiday, called Arbor Day, was first observed with the planting of more than a million trees in Nebraska; and
- WHEREAS: Arbor Day is now observed throughout the nation and the world; and
- WHEREAS: trees can reduce the storm water runoff, clean the water and air, provide wildlife habitat; and
- WHEREAS: research has proven that communities with a healthy tree canopy have citizens that are healthier, safer and have students who are better able to concentrate; and
- WHEREAS: trees in our city increase property values, enhance the economic vitality of business areas, and beautify our community.

NOW, THEREFORE: I, Duke A Bennett, Mayor of the City of Terre Haute, do hereby proclaim Saturday, April 24, 2021 as
