

PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS:	Indiana is celebrating its bicentennial and the signature event is a 92-county torch relay; and
WHEREAS:	the purpose of the relay is designed to inspire and unify Hoosiers as one; and
WHEREAS:	starting in Corydon, the state's first capital, on September 9, 2016, Hoosiers will symbolically "pass the torch" connecting generations to ignite our future; and
WHEREAS:	the torch will cover 3, 200 miles, in 37 days, cover 260 cities and towns, including: 17 state and national parks, 9 lakes and rivers, 27 national, state and local sites of historic significance, and 22 colleges and universities; and
WHEREAS:	the relay will employ modes of conveyance that are symbolic of the history and heritage of Indiana, including watercraft, farm equipment, a racecar, horse and wagon, antique automobile, and others; and
WHEREAS:	torchbearers were nominated by the public and selected by local committees on a county- by-county basis; and
WHEREAS:	many counties are holding special events and ceremonies to commemorate this historic event; and
WHEREAS:	The Bicentennial Experience, a mobile history exhibit showcasing Indiana's far reaching influence, will make stops along the relay route; and
WHEREAS:	the relay will culminate in Indianapolis on the Statehouse Grounds, with a special "Hoosier Homecoming" ceremony on October 15, 2016.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Mayor Duke A Bennett, do hereby proclaim September 8 - October 15, 2016 as a time for all citizens of Terre Haute to rejoice in Indiana's 200 years of statehood through the Bicentennial Torch Relay.
