WHEREAS:	the emergency medical services system consists of first responders, emergency medical technicians, paramedics, emergency medical dispatchers, firefighters, police officers, educators, administrators, pre-hospital nurses, emergency nurses, emergency physicians, trained members of the public and other out of hospital medical care providers; and
WHEREAS:	the members of emergency medical services teams, wherever career or volunteer, engage in thousands of hours of specialized training and continuing education to enhance their lifesaving skills; and
WHEREAS:	it is appropriate to recognize the value and the accomplishments of emergency medical services providers by designating Emergency Medical Services Week.
