Welcome to the monthly newsletter from The Office of the Mayor, curated by Mayor Brandon Sakbun himself. This newsletter will highlight upcoming city events, street closures, city project updates, public safety information, and whatever else Mayor Brandon thinks you all, the citizens, should be informed of.

"April will be a historic month for Terre Haute. I wanted to provide an update regarding the casino opening and anticipated revenues. Communities receive funds through a supplemental wagering tax (40% of 2.9% adjusted gross revenue), a wagering tax (25% of graduated wagering taxes paid by the casino to the state), a property tax, and a local developer agreement.

The City of Terre Haute is running estimates to calculate estimated tax revenue from the supplemental wagering tax and wagering tax. Wagering tax revenues should be paid monthly to the city and we anticipate around \$5 million. Supplemental wagering tax is distributed quarterly and we estimate approximately \$1M. The local developer agreements are signed by county officials, although the casino resides in the city. We are working with county elected officials to finalize those funds and their use. In June, the administration will release a proposed spending plan for casino tax dollars.

The solar eclipse is next Monday, April 8th!

It has been **819** years since the path of totality has swept across the Terre Haute area. Totality is a very different viewing experience. A total solar eclipse is a night and day difference from a partial solar eclipse (which Terre Haute experienced in 2017).

March 27th, 2024- Mayor Brandon dives into what you can expect on the day of the Eclipse!

"Terre Haute is ready to welcome people from around the world to view this once-in-a-lifetime

celestial event. Terre Haute is poised to expect 35,000-50,000 people beginning the weekend before April 8th. The Eclipse coincides with the opening of our new casino. Both these events will draw large crowds. This influx of people will benefit our community's local economy and bring new customers to our local businesses and restaurants. The Convention and Visitors Bureau and the City of Terre Haute have broadcasted this information to local businesses to allow them to plan for staffing and operational activities.

At solar events such as these, the majority of visitors who arrive by car, leave shortly after the eclipse causing a temporary traffic jam. At times traffic will likely be painful. We have been proactively coordinating and collaborating with the Vigo County Sheriff's Department, Indiana State Troopers, city employees, and other organizations to prepare for public safety concerns. We anticipate slow but safe traveling. I recommend local residents take back streets as opposed to major throughways if they need to travel and give themselves ample time to get from point A to point B.

Please remember to be safe when viewing the eclipse and use appropriate eyewear. Let's embrace the visitors in Terre Haute and show them why we're Terredise!"

Terre Haute is preparing to host several events from April 5th-8th. As you know, there will be an influx of visitors coming to our community to witness this natural event. Here is a checklist to help you be prepared, avoid crowds, and enjoy a safe Total Solar Eclipse!

- Ensure that all your grocery shopping, prescriptions, and errands are done. Having your home fully stocked for the week of the Eclipse is crucial due to the expected increase in visitors and traffic. Normal routines might be hard to keep up with and could pose safety risks during the peak of the Eclipse.
- Make sure to have plenty of water on hand to avoid dehydration.
- Meetup Plan: Assume no cell service; plan meeting spots before and after the eclipse.
- Handheld radio: Helpful for weather and traffic updates without internet access.
- Full tank of gas: Don't forget to fill your gas tanks! Our local gas stations may run low or even run out during this tourist influx.
- Healthcare, medications, oxygen-Ask your healthcare provider or pharmacy how you can get an extra supply of medicines & oxygen. Don't let these items run low!
- Make sure you have your eclipse safety glasses or viewers!

When rain falls, the water that flows across streets and parking lots can carry a variety of pollutants like trash, dirt, oil, grass clippings, and toxic chemicals into nearby storm drains. From there, this polluted stormwater flows untreated into rivers, lakes, and streams, posing risks to plants, animals, and human health. Preventing this runoff requires collective action from our communities. Everyday activities, if not properly managed, can lead to accidental spills and leaks, further endangering the storm drain system and local waterways. Effective planning and readiness empower citizens to respond promptly to issues and minimize the discharge of pollutants into the environment.
