On January 30th, I testified at the State Legislature in support of Senate Bill 382.

Senate Bill 382 establishes a local board of trusted leaders—including the County Commissioner, Mayor, County Council Member, School Corporation Member, and a Chamber representative—to oversee and guide the use of any county funds or property provided to the school corporation. This board ensures transparency, accountability, and responsible management of resources, reinforcing the community's trust in the process. The bill also requires that if the county transfers or gifts any unused funds or property to the school corporation, this local board will provide oversight to ensure those resources are used effectively and in the best interest of the community.

Modern schools are the cornerstone of a thriving economy. By making schools community assets, we attract families, retain businesses, and create a foundation for long-term growth.

As Mayor of Terre Haute, I acknowledge that our schools are an obstacle to our community's future growth. This state bill and upcoming decisions by the **county government** will allow the county to fund renovations to the **school corporation**. I firmly support our county government officials in their endeavor to fund an upcoming renovation without a tax increase.

Our kids in our community deserve better. They deserve quality schools that provide adequate learning facilities. The current leadership at the Vigo County School Corporation, County, and City cannot go back in time to change previous decisions, however, we can take a stand in the present to prioritize our children and our community's future now.

THFD WINTER SAFETY TIPS

- 1. Keep all combustibles at least 3ft away from any heat source.
- 2. Install and regularly check Carbon Monoxide (CO) alarms
- Never bring a generator inside. This includes the basement, crawl space, and attached garage. Generators should be at least 20ft away from any doors or windows of the home.
- 4. If outside dress in layers, take frequent breaks, and don't forget to hydrate with water or a low sugar sports drink
- 5. Have a weeks worth of medication on hand at all times
- 6. Check in on elderly and disabled neighbors

The demolition of the old Vigo County School Corporation building at 686 Wabash Avenue is in full swing. This site is being prepared for the construction of a new hotel, which will bring significant economic and tourism benefits to the area.

Max Ehrmann at the Crossroads by artist Bill Wolfe, located on the corner of Wabash Avenue and 7th Street in downtown Terre Haute, has been relocated. *Max* will be moving to his new permanent home in the sidewalk bump-out area on the east side of 7th Street directly across from the Swope Art Museum. *Max*'s move is a result of the demolition and construction of a new hotel coming to the downtown space

where the sculpture currently resides.

The City of Terre Haute and Art Spaces have been working closely with Land Stewards Design Group and Bill Wolfe to design a beautiful, new, and inviting space that will continue sharing the legacy of Max Ehrmann and his sculpture. Max will be in storage for a short amount of time while the space is being designed and built, but will return downtown as soon as possible.

The old police department building at 1211 Wabash Avenue is also scheduled for demolition after completion of the old Vigo County School Corporation building demolition. This property will be redeveloped into a residential building, contributing to Terre Haute's housing growth and urban renewal. Both parcels already have a large transformational project lined up to continue downtown Terre Haute's revitalization.
