Upcoming Sidewalk Projects

The City of Terre Haute is set to invest approximately \$800,000 in sidewalk improvements this year—double the





amount spent in 2024—without increasing taxes. This investment is made possible through available funds from gaming tax revenue rather than property or income taxes.

Funding and Fiscal Responsibility

Mayor Brandon Sakbun highlighted the City's approach to financing these projects responsibly. "We had funds available without looking at property taxes or income taxes... We were able to do this without raising taxes of any level," Sakbun explained.

Planned Projects and Areas of Improvement

The City has identified two key areas for new sidewalk installations:

- Herz-Rose Park area
- Sarah Scott Middle School area

In addition to these new projects, the City will be addressing a backlog of sidewalk maintenance requests to improve overall pedestrian accessibility.

Project Timeline

The work will take place in two phases:

- Phase 1: Begins this spring
- Phase 2: Starts later in the summer

These improvements align with the City's goals of enhancing public infrastructure, increasing accessibility, and supporting public health. More details will be provided as the projects progress.

Park Projects update

Terre Haute Parks & Recreation is thrilled to announce a series of park improvement projects set to take place throughout 2025. These upgrades are happening in conjunction with the ongoing large scale projects at Herz-Rose, Rea, and Deming Park. The upgrades below aim to enhance recreational spaces across the City, ensuring a safe and enjoyable experience for residents and visitors alike.

Spring 2025 Upgrades

- Collett Park: Asphalt overlay on tennis courts to improve texture.
- Anaconda Park: Replacement of the basketball goal to enhance recreational opportunities.
- Deming Park: Resurfacing of the 5-12 side of the playground and the application of a new playground coating (weather permitting).
- Deming Archway: Replacement of planks to restore its structure and aesthetics.
- Booker T. Washington Park: Installation of a centerpiece for the platform and necessary playground repairs.

Fall 2025 Enhancements

- Citywide Park System: A wayfinding update to improve navigation and signage across parks.
- Washington Park: Expansion of the playground to accommodate more visitors.
- Collett Park: Expansion of the playground to increase play options for families.

The installation of new playground equipment is scheduled to be completed by Fall 2025. All projects are expected to be finished before the end of Summer 2025, ensuring the community can enjoy these improvements as soon as possible.

"The City is currently undergoing several large scale park renovations like Herz Rose, Rea, the YMCA, and the Deming Park Pool." Said Mayor Brandon Sakbun, "The projects listed above may be smaller in size and scope but they will have a lasting impact on neighborhoods and in our community. We continue to do more with less here in Terre Haute. None of these projects are funded by property taxes and no tax increases were used to make all of this happen."

MAYOR'S YOUTH COUNCIL

The Mayor's Youth Council is excited to announce the launch of its fundraising campaign through the Indiana Housing and Community Development Authority's (IHCDA) CreatINg Places program. This campaign will run from Wednesday, February 12th, to March 28th, offering the community a unique opportunity to support



accessible playground space in the City-owned Coy Park in North Terre Haute.

The IHCDA has pledged a matching grant, meaning that if the Mayor's Youth Council reaches its goal of \$35,000, IHCDA will match the funds, doubling the impact of the campaign. 
